

AMY AND AMRIT GILL

PRINCIPALS RESTORATION ST. LOUIS

Amrit and Amy Gill are the husband-and-wife developer team who restored midtown architectural treasures like Coronado Place and The Moolah Temple. Now they are embarking on an ambitious redevelopment effort in the Forest Park Southeast neighborhood. So far, they've invested \$20 million buying homes and vacant lots, and they plan to raise that to \$50 million in acquisition and development costs within the next three years. Born in Jalandhar, India, Amrit Gill came to St. Louis in 1988 to attend Washington University. He worked for the General Railroad Group in the early 1990s as an analyst in mergers and acquisitions. By then, he had married Amy Harris, who shared his keen interest in old buildings. The couple bought and renovated properties in the University City Loop and Skinker-DeBaliviere area before moving east to renovate the Coronado into a student-oriented building with apartments, retail and office space and the Moolah Temple into apartments, a movie theater and an eight-lane bowling alley.
